
#### **COIDES**

When you arrive back in Harburg, on a hill called "Bock", you'll find the last station of the trail, known as "Pluto". From here you can enjoy the view of the Ries crater which was formed when a meteorite hit the ground about 15 million years ago. If you would like to learn more about this unique and fascinating phenoton you can book a special guided tour.

# FANTASTIC VIEW & EXTENSIVE FORESTS

Our trails around Harburg start at the "Unterer Burgparkplatz" (parking can be found below the Castle) leading you along a charming grass path to the former Jewish cemetery and the top of the "Hühnerberg". Walking through heathland, typical vegetation of the Ries, we reach "Pluto" – the Harburg station, found on the Planet Trail. From here you have a spectacular view of the Ries Crater and of the valley where the river Wörnitz stretches as far as Donauwörth. On we go to the summit cross on the "Bockberg" hill, one of our many natural monuments on the south-east border of the Ries crater. A fter descending again and walking a short distance through the adjoining forest, we arrive at the idyllic

"Biergarten Eisbrunn, a traditional restaurant surrounded by a romantic forest filled with many exotic tree species. We walk back through the forest and along field tracks and eventually reach the entrance of the castle here in Harburg. Did you know, it is one of the best preserved castles in Southern Germany, dating back to the time of the Staufer. From here you can stroll along the historical walls and have a look at many of our interesting exhibitions. To enter the castle's interior and learn more about its history one should book a guided tour.
